Why?	Mount Pisgah systematically chooses how they share your personal information. Federal law grants consumers the right to limit some but not all sharing. Federal law also requires us to tell you how we collect, share, and protect your personal information. What?	The type of personal information we collect and share varies based on the type of leadership position held. This information can include: Home address, landline, and cellular numbers Church address, phone number, and point of contact for your church and partnership Transaction history regarding covenant partner, debt-free, and contributions	
How?	Mount Pisgah shares your personal information to run our everyday business. In the section below, we list the reasons Mount Pisgah chooses to share; and whether you can limit this sharing.

How does Mount Pisgah protect my personal information?	 To protect your personal information from unauthorized access and use Mount Pisgah employs security measures that comply with federal law. 		
How does Mount Pisgah collect my personal information?	We collect your personal information, for example, when you Submit an application for membership Register for our national or regional conference programs Participate in sessions with our corporate sponsors/partners We also collect your personal information from other organizational leaders and administrators		
Why can't I limit all sharing?	Federal law gives you the right to limit: sharing for affiliates' everyday business purposes non-partners from using your information to market to you sharing for non-partners to market to you State laws and individual companies may give you additional rights to limit sharing. What happens when I limit sharing for an account I hold jointly with someone else?	Your choices will apply to everyone listed on your database profile.		

Definitions		
Partners	Companies related by common ownership or control. They can be financial and nonfinancial companies. Our partners include member churches of Mount Pisgah; corporate sponsors/partners, and financial companies	
Non-Partners	Companies not related by common ownership or control. They can be financial and nonfinancial companies. Mount Pisgah does not share your information with non-partners.	
Joint marketing	A formal agreement between non-partners financial companies that together market financial products or services to you. This includes collaborative marketing ads with sponsors/partners
